City of Mt. Pleasant, Michigan INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

1. Proposals

Proposals must be made upon the forms provided therefore, with the Bid amount both written and shown in figures, and all other data required submitted.

The Proposal, bound together with all Proposal Documents, must be enclosed in a sealed envelope marked as specified in the Notice to Bidders for such Bid and clearly indicating the name and address of the Bidder and must be received by the City Clerk, City Hall, 320 West Broadway Street, Mt. Pleasant, Michigan 48858, no later than the time and date specified in the Notice to Bidders. At such specified time, Proposals shall be publicly opened and read aloud.

2. **Basis of Proposals**

Proposals are solicited on the basis of unit price(s) and/or lump sum(s), as specified on the Proposal form.

The City of Mt. Pleasant (also referred to as "Owner"), reserves the right to accept any Bid, to reject any or all Bids, to waive any irregularities in the Bids, and to select the Bid considered most advantageous to the city.

3. Comparison of Bids

In comparing Bids, consideration shall be given to the time proposed for completion of the Contract, qualifications of Bidder, price differentials, alternate Proposals for the alternate items listed in the Proposal (if applicable), and any other pertinent factors. The City of Mt. Pleasant grants a preference to businesses located within the Mt. Pleasant City Limits. The preference given is a differential above the low bid if the low bid is not from a City of Mt. Pleasant bidder. The differential allowed is 3% of the total for bids between \$5,000 and \$9,999 and 2% of the total for bids over \$10,000. The maximum credit allowed is \$1500.00. The Owner reserves the right to make an award to the Bidder whose Proposal is deemed to be in the best interest of the Owner.

4. <u>Time</u>

Time is of the essence in the performance of the Contract, and each Bidder, by submitting a Proposal, certifies his/her acceptance of the time allowed by the Contract for the completion of the work specified.

5. **Indemnification**

The Contractor shall save and hold harmless the city and its employees from and against all claims, damages, losses, or expenses, including attorney's fees, arising out of or resulting from the performance of the work; provided that any such claim, damage, loss or expense is caused in whole or in part by any negligent or willful act of omission of the contractor, subcontractor, employee, or anyone under their direction. The Contractor shall at his/her own expense, defend any and all such actions and shall pay all attorney's fees, costs, and expenses pertaining thereto.

6. **Bid Deposits**

Each Proposal shall be accompanied by a certified check, or a Bid Bond by a recognized Surety Company similar to a U. S. Government Standard Form Bid Bond, in the amount of five percent (5%) of the total amount of the Bid, made payable to the City of Mt. Pleasant, subject to forfeiture to the Owner in the event of failure on the part of the successful Bidder to enter into the attached form of agreement to do the work specified by said Proposal at the price and within the time stated therein. The Bid Deposit of all Bidders, except the three (3) lowest acceptable Bidders, shall be returned within two (2) weeks after opening of bids. The bid deposits of the three (3) lowest acceptable bidders shall be returned within 48 hours after the executed Contract(s) have been finally approved by the Owner.

7. Liquidated Damages

A liquidated damage clause, as given in the Contract form, provides that the Contractor shall pay the Owner as liquidated damages, and not as a penalty, the amount indicated in the Proposal for each and every calendar day that the Contractor may be in default of substantial completion of the work required under said Contract.

8. **Insurance and Bonds**

The successful Bidder will be required to execute (2) Bonds, in the form attached hereto, with Surety acceptable to the Owner and insurance, as follows:

- a. Bond in the amount of 100% of the Estimated Contract Price running to the City of Mt. Pleasant, Michigan, to insure the completion of the entire work, according to the statues of the State of Michigan in effect at that time.
- b. Bond in the amount of 100% of the Estimated Contract Price running to the People of the State of Michigan for the protection of Subcontractors and Labor and Material Men, according to the statutes of the State of Michigan in effect at that time.
- c. Insurance in the amounts required by City Ordinance as specified in the Section 1 General Construction Specifications, attached hereto.

The successful bidder shall be required to furnish for each set of executed Contract Documents, and conformed copies thereof, an original conformed Performance Bond, Labor and Materials Bond, Maintenance Bond, and Insurance Certificates.

9. **Permits and Local Codes**

The Owner shall procure the required permits for municipal sanitary sewer construction, municipal water system construction, and soil erosion control.

The Contractor shall obtain, at his/her expense, all other required local construction permits and shall comply with local building code and inspection requirements.

10. Qualifications of Bidders

It is the intent of the Owner to award the Contract to a Bidder fully capable, both financially and with regard to experience, to perform and complete all work in a satisfactory and timely manner. Evidence of such competency must be furnished on the forms included in the proposal, listing projects of similar difficulty, scope of work, and size, which the Bidder has satisfactorily undertaken and completed.

It is the intention of the City to award the contract to a Contractor whose ability and financial resources are fully equal to the task of performing the work in a satisfactory manner. With this in view, the Proposal calls for at least five (5) references, using specific names of persons to contact concerning the Contractor's ability to do this particular class of work. References from municipalities are preferred. The mere ability to furnish a Performance Bond shall not be accepted as sufficient evidence of responsibility on the part of the Bidder. The Bidder may also be required to furnish evidence of his current financial status.

11. Interpretation of Documents

If any Bidder is in doubt as to the true meaning of any part of the Plans, Specifications or any Contract Document, he/she may submit to the Owner a <u>written</u> request for an interpretation thereof. Any interpretation made in response to such a query shall be made only by Addendum, duly issued, and a copy of such Addendum shall be mailed or duly delivered to each prospective Bidder. The Owner shall not be responsible for any other explanation or interpretation of the Contract Documents. Alternative proposals that are suggested by bidders will be given consideration, if presented before the bid opening. If accepted, an addendum will be issued and sent out to all potential bidders, so that they may bid on the alternatives that have been identified.

12. Execution of Bid Proposal

A Bid Proposal, which is not signed by the individual making it, should have attached thereto a Power of Attorney evidencing authority to sign the Bid Proposal in the name of the person for whom it is signed.

A Bid Proposal, which is signed by a partnership, shall be signed by all of the partners or by an Attorney-in-Fact. If signed by an Attorney-in-Fact, there should be attached to the Bid a Power of Attorney evidencing authority to sign the Bid Proposal in the name of the partnership and such Power of Attorney shall be signed by all partners of the partnership.

A Bid Proposal, which is signed for a corporation, should have the correct corporate name thereof and the signature of the President, or other authorized officer(s) of the corporation, manually written below the corporate name and on the line indicating "By:________." If such a Bid Proposal is manually signed by an officer other than the President of the corporation, a certified copy of a Resolution of the Board of Directors evidencing the authority of such officer(s) to sign the Bid Proposal should be attached thereto. Such a Bid Proposal should also bear the attested signature of the Secretary of the corporation and an impression of the corporate seal.

13. **Execution of Contract**

The successful Bidder to whom an award is made shall be required to enter into a written agreement, in the form attached hereto, within ten (10) days after receipt of a Notice of Award and copies of the documents to be executed. In the event the successful Bidder fails to comply with this provision, he/she may be considered by the Owner to have abandoned all his/her rights and interests in the award and his/her certified check or amount of the Bid Bond may be declared to be forfeited to the Owner, and the Contract may be awarded to another.

14. <u>Bidder Responsibility For Conditions of Work and Site</u>

The Bidder, or his/her representative, shall make personal investigation of the site of work and of existing structures and shall determine to his/her own satisfaction the conditions to be encountered, the nature of the ground, the difficulties involved in making connections to existing structures and pipes, and any and all other factors affecting the work proposed under the Contract.

The Bidder to whom the Contract is awarded shall not be entitled to any additional compensation by reason of conditions being different from those anticipated or by reason of his/her failure to fully acquaint himself/herself with the conditions at the site affecting the work of the Contract.

15. Changes in Work

If any change is required to be made in the work of the Contract, a payment adjustment therefore shall be determined as specified in the "TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS, Section 1 - General Construction Specifications" of the Contract.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS 2010 STREET MILL & OVERLAY PROJECT

Scope of Work

This project includes the cold-milling and resurfacing of city streets. The bituminous material to be used shall be 1300T 20AAA. For the Thin Overlay portion of the project, the bituminous material to be used shall be an ultra-thin mixture meeting the specifications of this contract.

The following streets shall be cold-milled a depth of two inches (2") and resurfaced with bituminous mixture 1300T 20AAA at a rate of 220# SYD:

Adams Street – Broadway to Pickard
East Grand – Broadway to Crosslane
Gaylord – Brown to Crapo
Heritage – Illinois to dead end
Illinois – Crapo to dead end
Lansing – Broadway to Cherry
Maple – Fancher to Franklin
May – Douglas to Pleasant

McVey – Johnson to Lynnwood Orchard – Broomfield to Country Way Patrick Court – Patrick to dead end Pleasant – May to dead end University – Lincoln to Pickard West Grand – Broadway to Crosslane Whitney – Elm to Mary Ann

**All street overlays will be done between existing curb and gutter structures. The City Street Department will make necessary base repairs and pave areas that need new bituminous pavement, such as some utility cuts and other distressed areas of the pavement. The City will also make curb repair and/or replacement deemed necessary prior to the placement of any overlay.

Contractor Schedule

The contractor shall provide to the street superintendent a schedule indicating the order in which the streets will be resurfaced, and an approximate schedule of when the work will be done on each street. This schedule must be given to the street superintendent at least two weeks prior to beginning the project so that area residents can be notified and manhole adjustments can be made.

Working Hours and Holidays

No work is to be scheduled by the contractor on Sundays. The daily hours of work are given in the General Construction Specifications, paragraph 20. The starting and completion dates shall be according to the Notice to Proceed, Proposal, and Special Conditions.

Time Constraints

The project shall not start before August 1, 2010 and shall be completed by August 31, 2010. The Contractor shall coordinate their work schedule to ensure that placement of the bituminous surface on Preston Street occurs within two days of the milling operation on Preston Street. The contractor shall maintain dust control at all

times between the milling operation and the paving operation. The contractor shall provide and maintain lighted barricades for all structures or utilities in the streets following milling of the surface. The notice to proceed will be issued after the preconstruction meeting. Liquidated damages will be assessed at the rate of \$100.00 per day for each day the work is incomplete.

Permits - No Permits are anticipated for this project

Residential and Commercial Access

Access to driveways for local residents and businesses shall be maintained and available for use. All driveways shall be opened by the contractor when the contractor is not working, including all evenings, nights, Sundays, and holidays, except as approved in writing by the inspector and with written notification to the residents/owners by the contractor.

Road Closure

Streets and alleys may be closed to through traffic, open to adjacent residential and commercial properties as stipulated above.

Detours

No detours are anticipated for this project. Should the contractor's operations require a detour, all costs of setting up the detour including signage and all notifications (list available from DPW) shall be covered by the contractor. The Director of Public Works/City Engineer must approve all detours. Detour request shall be submitted in writing with back up information as to route, signage, time, dates and notifications to be made by the contractor.

Residential Refuse and Recyclable Collection

The City contractor for trash (refuse) collection is Sunset Waste of Pierson, Michigan and the contractor for recycling collection is Mid Michigan Industries (MMI) of Mt. Pleasant. Collection of both refuse and recycle begins at 7:30 a.m., Monday through Thursday. Specific collection days for each street to be resurfaced will be provided to the contractor prior to the start of the project. The contractor shall schedule the work to allow and provide access for refuse and recycling contractors to collect these materials. If the refuse and recycling contractors are unable to collect materials due to construction operations, then the construction contractor shall collect and dispose of the refuse, and collect and deliver the recyclable material to the Material Recovery Facility (MRF) on River Road at no cost to the city. It is the responsibility of the construction contractor to contact the refuse and recycling contractors to coordinate operations and to resolve complaints.

Milling Operation

The gutter on some of the streets has an asphalt overlay. The asphalt shall be removed in a manner that does not damage the gutter. Removing the asphalt from the gutter using the milling machine will not be allowed.

Local Bidders Preference

The City of Mt. Pleasant purchasing policy stipulates:

The City of Mt. Pleasant grants a preference to businesses located within the Mt. Pleasant City Limits. The preference given is a differential above the low bid if the low bid is not from a City of Mt. Pleasant bidder. The differential allowed is 3% of the total for bids between \$5,000.00 and \$9,999.00 and 2% of the total for bids over \$10,000. The maximum credit allowed is \$1,500.00.

Quantities

Although a compilation of measurements was taken, all quantities are estimated only. Any increase or decreases in the quantities are at the discretion of the Street Superintendent.
