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City to hold second Citizens' Academy of Mt. Pleasant; now accepting applications

MT. PLEASANT, Mich. – The second Citizens' Academy of Mt. Pleasant (CAMP) is now accepting applications.

Presented by the City of Mt. Pleasant, the academy is designed to engage members of the community motivated to expand their knowledge of the structure and functions of the local government.

Participants will attend seven sessions from 6 to 8:30 p.m. on the following Tuesdays: Feb. 21 and 28; March 14, 21 and 28; and April 11 and 18. Each session will offer an in-depth look at the fundamentals of the City's administration and budget; public works and utilities; parks and recreation; public safety; and community development. Topics also covered will include the basics of local government, elections, and more. Graduates of the academy will be honored at a City Commission meeting on April 24.

The Citizens' Academy is open to anyone living, working or attending school in the City.
